The aim and scope of the special session:

Waterfronts have been the stage of important urban and functional transformations within the emergence and consolidation of the post-industrial city. A process that has been driven by the need to promote the requalification of these land-water interface areas, creating new centralities, responding to new urban demands and promoting the image of the city.

Nowadays, waterfront redevelopment processes face new and complex challenges, which should be further analyzed and discussed. In this context, contributions (including original research, reviews and case studies) on the following topics are welcomed: waterfront adaptation to climate change; redevelopment of waterfront brownfield sites; identity and cultural heritage in the post-industrial waterfront; innovative strategies and projects for waterfronts redevelopment; waterfront governance models; new challenges on urban-port waterfronts; other specific issues related to waterfront redevelopment processes (e.g. environmental issues, tourism, transports, accessibilities and mobility).

The session will be bilingual (Portuguese and English). Papers presented may be published in a book to be organized (this publication depends on the existence of a sufficient number of papers).
