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Special Session (SS05) on:

Inclusive cities – relations with urban real matrix

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The aim and scope of the special session:

Starting from the idea of an universal knowledge and particular historic experience of the city as creation of human culture, corresponding in every time as a relationship with a real urban matrix, which very probably never managed to create a truly inclusive social environment, it is proposed for this special session the discussion on the following question: *How to learn planning inclusive(s) town(s)?*

After second post-war period, the urban planning was gradually transformed into a process of land zoning, without a support structure or hierarchy, without reference to geography, topology or local historical tradition and without connection to a desired configurational syntax space, which has led to the deconstruction of the landscape and to the entropy of territorialization forms.

This reality, which sees the city as a *growth machine* where space is understood as a commodity (Logan and Harvey, 2007), demonstrates an absence of "urbanism" meaning in its various expressions, that any process of teaching has enormous difficulties to manage both theoretical or empirical way.
