**The aim and scope:**

The aim of this Special Session (SS) is to discuss studies about socioeconomic inequalities in urban and rural areas in the context of sustainable transitions. This SS expects texts that use theoretical and methodological tools from the field of Economic Geography, that is, those focused on issues such as the location and (unequal) distribution of economic activities, in short, territorial development. Research submissions are expected to address key agents (such as companies, the labour force, and the state) and drivers (such as innovations, entrepreneurship, and institutions). Sectors of interest: transitions in energy, agri-food, transport, industry, waste management, forestry, etc.
